XVI.3 That plurality of wives depends greatly on their maintenance

Although in countries where polygamy is once established, the number of wives is largely dependent on the husband's wealth, nevertheless one cannot say that it is because of wealth that polygamy becomes established in a state: poverty can have the same effect, as I shall affirm when I discuss savages.

Polygamy is less a luxury than the occasion of great luxury among powerful nations. In warm climates one has fewer needs [1]; thus it costs less to maintain a wife and children. Therefore a man can have more wives.
