

Island peoples have more affinity for liberty than continental peoples. Islands are ordinarily relatively small [1]; part of the people cannot be so well employed oppressing the rest; the sea separates them from the great empires, and one tyranny cannot come to the aid of another; conquerors are halted by the sea, the islanders are not caught up in the conquest, and more easily preserve their laws.
